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

🗼 Intro to the readings

Today the children's time, readings, hymns & sermon are all going to be combined.

Today's key passage goes way way back to near the beginning of the Bible. It may seem odd to go to something so old to shine some light on our lives now, but they do help us when it's dark. Think of it as like stars. The light from a star on the other side of our Galaxy takes 66 000 years to get here⁴ - and they help provide light when its dark.



Leading into today's stories God had tried working with everyone, but it wasn't working. So God decided to focus on one family and use them to show the world how good it is to trust and love God - and how God loves the world.

God chose Abram and Sarai (Abraham and Sarah). At the time they were old enough to be grandparents... except they hadn't had any kids, so they weren't.

Let's hear two passages where God makes promises to Abram. They were a few years apart. Listen to what is promised. Would you trust these promises?



Reading: Please look up the passages in your own Bible,⁵ or click on the name to be taken to an online version.

Genesis 12: 1-4 Genesis 15: 1-6



Dear Lord, please bless these words and the meditations of our hearts. Amen.

Abram was wondering what the point was to his life if it didn't lead to anything. With no kids, everything he'd accomplished would just disappear. What's the point? (Have you ever wondered what the point is for doing things?)

Then God shows up and invites Abram into the bigger picture. Perhaps like taking a star that's all by itself; no friends or family around for light-years - and then God shows that its part of a larger consternation, guiding sailors who would otherwise have no hope.

God invites Abram into something bigger by making a few promises:

- to make him great
- to bless him
- ...and that he will bless everyone in the world

- to have kids more blessings than the stars in the sky.

These are BIG promises.

Scientists don't know how many stars there are in the sky, but a guess is that there are 100 Billion in the Milky Way⁶ - which is just our Galaxy. God promises more blessings than that.

And while the promise is that Abram and Sarai will be blessed - it is also that through them everyone in the world will be blessed! That's also a lot (currently over 8 Billion⁷).



The thing with these promises is that they are impossible. People that old can not have children. It's just not reasonable or responsible to believe such things. Not only that - years go by with no sign of the promises coming true. ... It's no wonder that Abram gets discouraged.

How do you respond when somebody promises something you think is ridiculous? Do you trust the promise?

Perhaps, but only if your trust/faith in the person is bigger than the ridiculous promise.

Let's hear from a couple of more Bible passages.



Hebrews 11: 1-16+

Psalm 33

How does that faith happen? Some people are more generous in trusting others, but even then it needs some work. Brené

Brown talks about building trust as being like a marble jar. Every time you trust somebody with a little something and they don't let you down, it's like dropping a marble in the jar. Gradually your relationship builds and you can trust them with more of yourself. To put it another way, you look at what that person has done.



It can be the same with God. Some people are more generous in trusting God, and some need to check the marble jar. God's marbles come in a variety of ways. There's the light that shines from the old stories - like those in the Bible. This is why there's a big list of reminders in Hebrews. There are also the amazing things we listed earlier on the Flipchart. There's examples in our lives - perhaps a time of pain when others stood with you, or a time of need when others helped, or a time when you were brave enough to take a ridiculous risk, with unexpected blessings. Maybe it's a time when you thought you were blessing someone else, and discovered you were blessed in return.⁸


Let's take a ridiculous idea: God is going to use a church that was once big, but now isn't, with people who are busy or tired... or both, to be a witness to those who don't know anything about God. It can sound crazy, but it's happening. The movie night is getting people who don't go to church to gather with those who

do - and they not only share their lives, but we also talk about God in our lives. It's not forced. There's no examination. It's like the disciples who just shared what they experienced, and used that to figure it out. It's similar with Jesus & Java. We're also getting new people coming on Sunday. This shows that God's dream of using you to bring blessings to the world isn't crazy.

Through Jesus we are inheritors of Abram, some of the stars. I'm going to invite the children to take some stars and place them on your hand.

As inheritors of Abram, we also receive the promise that God will bless us - and use us to be a blessing to others.

After participating in the New Beginnings program, which guides congregations through a renewal process to discern God's call for their future, St. Giles Presbyterian Church in St. Catharines, ON, is exploring innovative ways to engage with their community. The congregation is turning faith into action by fostering a welcoming and supportive environment for individuals with disabilities and their families. They have created



a multi-sensory space where individuals with sensory sensitivities can find comfort and engagement. They hope to offer respite programming and support groups for caregivers who demonstrate a commitment to walking alongside them in their journey. The New Beginnings program receives funding from Presbyterians Sharing.


